



## Knockbreda Nursery School January 2020 Newsletter

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

We hope that you and your child had a wonderful Christmas break and wish you all a Happy New Year! Many thanks for the lovely gifts and cards we received before the Christmas break, they were sincerely appreciated by us all. We have enjoyed welcoming the children back to school and hearing all about their exciting Christmas holidays and of course, their favourite gifts! Thank you also for your generous support for our Christmas Jumper Day; Nursery raised £60.79 for Save the Children Fund.

#### Themes and topics

This half-term, our learning topic is The Cold Lands (Arctic and Antarctic), including Winter. The learning across our classrooms will focus on this topic, with many exciting activities taking place. We will be enjoying melting ice in the water tray, taking part in a seasonal investigation outdoors, creating snowmen and learning all about the season of Winter. We will be welcoming Mr Hullabaloo to Nursery this month and he will be performing a wonderful winter show for us all! We have included some of the songs and rhymes that we will be learning through our topic, so that you can share them with your child at home.

In Nursery we will be focusing on shapes, learning the names of the shapes and counting the number of sides and corners each shape has. We will be learning about squares, circles, rectangles and triangles. Please support this at home through the songs and rhymes included in the shape booklet (accompanying this newsletter).

#### Time of Session

As we wish each child to have as long a session as possible to enjoy all the opportunities we provide, please ensure that all children arrive in school **by 8.45am, to enjoy our morning Welcome Time session, with arrival at 8.50am at the very latest**. School lunch orders are placed at 9am and if your child arrives after this, they will have missed the daily meal orders. At home time please arrive promptly to pick your child up between 12.40-1pm. All children should leave the school site by **1pm prompt** each day. After this time, there are no staff on duty to care for your child. If you are delayed due to an emergency, please let us know so that we can explain this to your child and reassure them. Please ensure that this information is clearly communicated to anyone responsible for dropping off or collecting your child. Thank you.

#### **Office Hours**

The School Office is open from **9.15am – 12.45pm each day**. It would be appreciated if telephone calls to school could be made during these hours only as it is disruptive for the children if classroom staff are answering the telephone while the children are arriving and enjoying their morning Welcome Times in the Quiet Rooms. Many thanks for your support in this regard.

#### **Sickness and Absences**

• Please communicate any unplanned, unexpected absences by completing the online absence form (link below) on the first day of the absence:

- Any planned absences should be communicated in advance.
- **Diarrhoea and vomiting:** As detailed in your child's induction booklet, children should be **symptom-free for 48 hours** and should be able to hold down food and fluids before returning to school. Please do not send your child to school unless they have been symptom-free for 48 hours as this places the staff and other pupils at risk of illness.

#### Important information

 As we use all our outdoor play areas in all weather, please make sure that you return your child's named wellie boots into school and mittens/ hat/ scarf for colder days. Please clearly name all items and help your child become independent in putting on/ taking off their shoes, wellies, coats, hats and mittens. All school shoes should also be clearly named. It is recommended that the children now wear thermal, waterproof ski style mittens for outdoor play.

The Red Apples attend Forest School each Wednesday and the Green Apples each Thursday - please ensure that your child is suitably dressed on these days. It is preferable that the girls do not wear dresses and tights on for Forest School but wear thicker jogging style bottoms. It may also be advisable for all children to wear an additional under-layer as we are now into the colder weather and we play outside every day.

- For those paying termly, the school fund charge of £50 for this term (£150 for the year, ie 86p per day) should be paid by <u>Friday 24th January 2020</u>. This pays for your child's daily drink, fruit and bread-based snack, baking, play dough ingredients, Christmas and end of year parties, visitors who come into school each term, books for the school library and other items not covered by school's delegated budget. Cheques should be made payable to Knockbreda Nursery School (School Fund Account). Please do not hand monies or cheques to the members of staff in the classroom, rather use the secure grey fixed postbox in the reception foyer. Your support is much appreciated.
- In event of school closure due to snow, school will contact parents via email, directly from the school email account. If you have not provided school with an email address, please check the school website for closure information and also BBC News NI Live for details. Closure information will also be shared on the school website www.knockbredanursery.co.uk
- At our parent/carer consultation meetings in September, a number of parents enquired as to how they could best support their child at home throughout the Nursery year. In response to this, the Nursery staff have created a Parent/Carer support booklet to accompany each of the three Nursery terms. A paper copy of the Term 2 Support Booklet has been sent home in your child's tray. We hope you find this of use.

 To support our school curriculum, we would be very grateful if each child could bring in <u>one box of tissues, one pack of toilet wet wipes, one pack of baby wipes,</u> <u>one sellotape, one masking tape and a glue stick.</u> These items are for shared use and do not have to be named. Thank you in anticipation, your support with this is much appreciated.
